State FFA Convention Begins in Minneapolis

Session Highlights: Chapter Charters, Hall of Fame Inductees, Region Presidents, Alison Murrell and Miriana Eiden Retiring Addresses

MINNEAPOLIS – (April 21, 2024) Minnesota's 95th State FFA Convention opened tonight at 3M Arena at Mariucci in Minneapolis with the theme *Achieve. What It Takes.* The opening session featured chapter charters, Agriscience Fair awards, Hall of Fame induction, and region president recognition. The session was preceded by preliminary Leadership Development Events and a reception for FFA alumni.

Retiring State FFA Reporter, Miriana Eiden from the Buffalo chapter, gave the first of six retiring addresses from the 2023-2024 officer team which are scheduled during the course of the convention. Eiden spoke about positivity and perseverance in her retiring address titled, "Fill Your Cup."

"Being positive doesn't mean you don't have negative thoughts, it means you don't let those thoughts control your life," said Eiden.

Additionally, retiring State FFA Secretary, Alison Murrell from the Braham chapter, presented her retiring address during tonight's opening session. Murrell spoke on overcoming challenges during her retiring address titled, "Driven to Discover."

"A challenge is a challenge for a reason, and we are driven to have the courage to overcome them and encourage others to do the same," said Murrell.
