

2019 Minnesota State Fair FFA Landscape Design and Construction Competition

THEME - EDIBLE LANDSCAPES

The design should incorporate plant materials adapted for our area with edible parts.

ENTRIES

1. Entries close July 8. No deposit. Entry must be made in the name of the chapter actually in charge of the exhibit; please indicate which plot preferred, allocation of plots are first entered first received (see map page 3).
2. Exhibitors from the 2018 Minnesota State Fair will have priority reserving the same space for this Minnesota State Fair, if they return their entry form by the entry closing date.
3. Exhibits will be confirmed by the receipt of the entry on a first come, first served basis, until all spaces have been awarded. If more schools wish to participate and remit requests than space allows, a waiting list will be established.
4. Limit of one entry per chapter. However, chapters willing to enter a second display should indicate this on the entry form. If spaces are not filled by the entry closing date, these chapters will be notified to enable them to make a second entry. Second entries will be accepted in the order in which they are received until all spaces are filled.
5. Space provided outside the Miracle of Birth Center, sites approximately 14' x 14'.

CONSTRUCTION

Exhibits may be placed beginning June 1; by appointment only, so as not to conflict with off-season event scheduling. All exhibits must be in place by 12:01 a.m. Thursday, Aug. 22; judging will commence at 8 a.m., Thursday. Chapters may not have representatives in the display area during judging.

Props may be removed beginning at 5 p.m. Monday, Sept.2 (Labor Day). If you wish to store your materials, arrangements for storage must be made through the MOBC superintendent.

Access to electric service will be provided by the fair, illumination provided by exhibitor. For safety reasons, all electrical wiring and devices must meet minimum electrical code and fire safety requirements. Commercial garden lights, or any other type of light bulb, may be used in the display. Fire hazards and potentially hazardous electrical devices or layouts must be avoided. Electrical devices will be turned off at the close of each day, and turned on each morning before the MOBC exhibit opens.

In the interest of maintaining an aesthetically pleasing area for others, we request the site be left in a condition that is neat and tidy before and after the fair. Please consider including permanent plant material for visual impact.

MAINTENANCE

Exhibitors are responsible for the maintenance of the display including plant material and any mechanical device, lighting, etc. Plants may be either planted directly into the plot or kept in their original containers (which must contain soil medium). After your installation and initial watering, staff from the State Fair will handle the watering of your exhibit. Please email instructions to Virginia Mold at virginia.mold@mnstatefair.org.

LABELING

All plant material must be properly labeled showing both the common and botanical names, State Fair will provide plant markers (for consistency). Use plants which are recommended for Minnesota. Chapters will be permitted to list on a sign (no larger than 5" x 8") the names of firms and organizations who have contributed to the display. No addresses or phone numbers will be permitted. State Fair will provide plant label stakes which have face plates that are 4.5" x 2.25". Please return the label stakes at the end of the fair.

Use a sign displaying the theme. This will be included in judging for the label category.

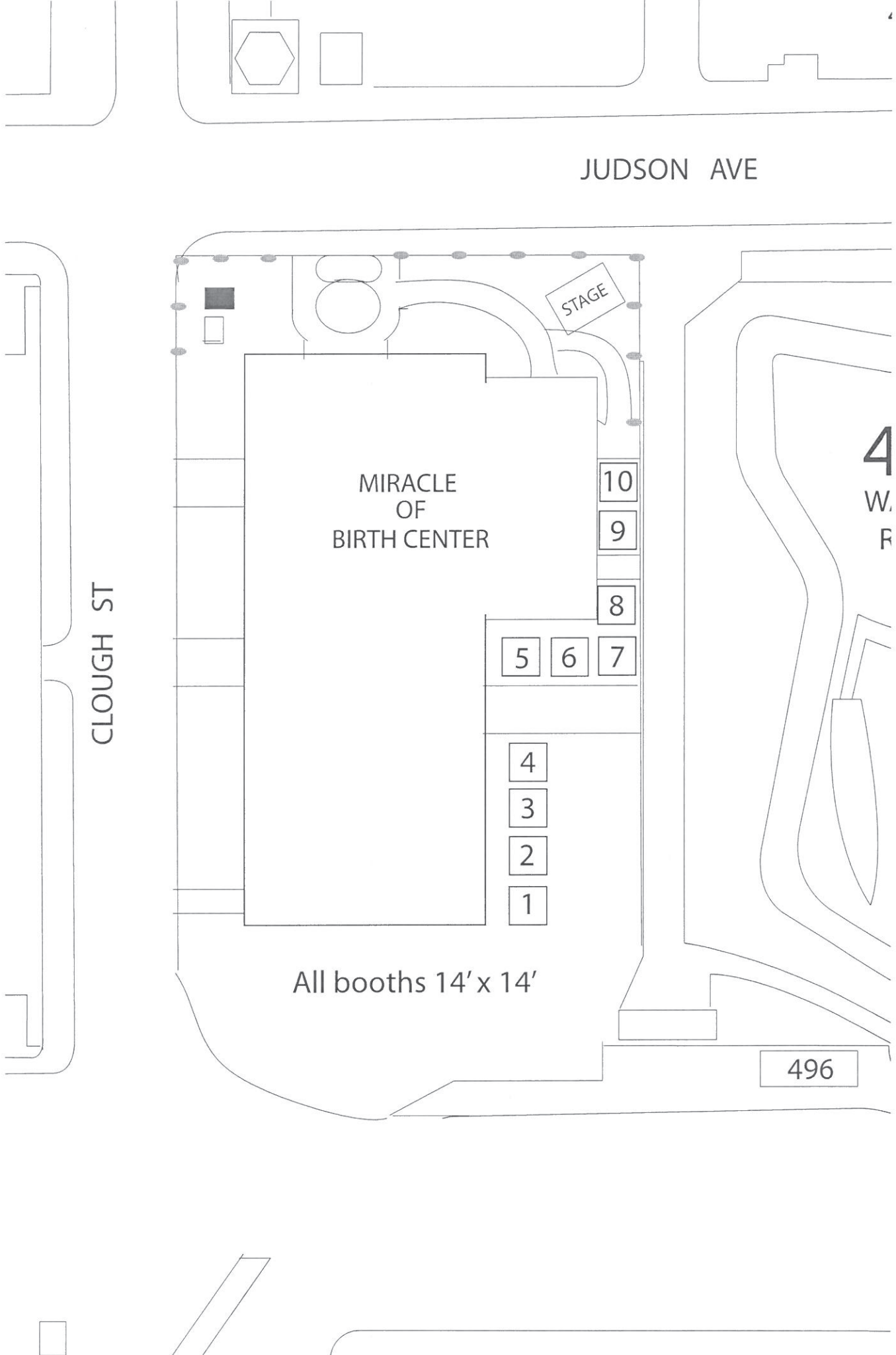

Evaluation criteria: Plant characteristics consistent with theme; high quality stock (balanced, full foliage, no broken stems, disease-free, pest-free, and free of other defects).

Evaluation criteria: Selection of appropriate size, variety, quantity, and quality of accessories and lights; items support the theme; balance of accent and background lighting; lights and other accessories are functioning.
