Returning in 2020, **inTENse** is an opportunity offered by Minnesota FFA for students in grades 10 and 11 to gain hands-on experiences in agricultural careers and at Minnesota colleges and universities. Participants will travel together with students their age and meet with agricultural teachers and leaders. Farm tours, business visits and engaging experiences on college campuses ranging from production agricultural to environmental science, agricultural technology and business skills will give students perspective and insight into career areas thriving on local, state, national and global levels.

No matter what you are interested in or what you are good at – you can find a career that uniquely fits you and serves others in Minnesota agriculture.

inTENse is tentatively \$200 per FFA member (\$225 per non-member) and includes 5 days and 4 nights of travel, lodging, meals and programming.

Tuesday
