State Degree Recipients Recognized at the Minnesota FFA Convention

Second session of convention includes Star awards, State FFA Degrees, Top Ten announcement, and retiring addresses from Lauren Stoel and Kaiya Grossman

MINNEAPOLIS, Minn. — The second session of the 2025 Minnesota FFA Convention in Minneapolis tonight (April 28) saw 451 students receive the State FFA Degree, while four members were named Stars for their efforts in the organization. The evening also included retiring addresses from Lauren Stoel and Kaiya Grossman, 2024-2025 state officers.

Stars

Four Minnesota FFA members were named as the organization's top achievers. These recognitions, known as the Star awards, are presented annually to the top individuals from four different Supervised Agricultural Experience areas and are sponsored by Compeer Financial Services. The Star awards program recognizes members for their outstanding achievement and dedication to their SAEs.

State Degrees

A record 451 agriculture, food and natural resources education students from across the state were awarded with Minnesota State FFA Degrees. The degree is given to the top

members of a state FFA Association, and only two percent of Minnesota FFA members earn the distinction. It demonstrates the student has put an exceptional amount of time into their FFA experience and has gone above and beyond in their local chapter and community. The state degree charms are sponsored by Riverview LLP.

Top Ten Chapters Announced

Minnesota's top three FFA Chapters were recognized, along with the remaining seven of the top 10 chapters. Over the past year, these chapters have been dedicated to furthering their education, working on various projects and carrying out community service initiatives.
